# The reign of Christ **Stocktaking**

# Jeremiah 23: 1-6 Luke 23: 33-43

This Sunday is the last Sunday in the Christian year. We have travelled through the past 12 months since last Advent in the company of Luke. Like each one of the other gospels this one has its own distinctive themes. I wonder what our life together would look like if we evaluated the past year through the lens of Luke's themes and how this gospel bids us to follow. There is a good reason to do that kind of exercise / stocktake. The Uniting Church likes to weave together worship, witness and service. In other words, how does our worship inform and reflect the practice of the Christian life.

I wonder what has stood out for you in this year of Luke? Would it be the way in which this gospel balances 'stories' to do with men and women? Or, maybe it was its emphasis on cultural inclusion? There are certainly some parables that stand out that are peculiar to this gospel – the good Samaritan and the prodigal son and other stories that 'wee little man, Zacchaeus'. What may have stuck in your mind were Jesus' words from the cross, 'forgive the, for they know not what they do?' Maybe you will recall how that reading from the scroll of Isaiah where Luke effectively lays out for us the agenda of Jesus' public ministry: 'the spirit of the Lord is upon me ....'

The year ends in what might seem like a strange place. The reading set down turns our attention to the last temptation that Jesus faces in this gospel – and it takes place while he is on the cross. It begins with 'If you are the king of the Jews ....'. It is placed alongside another question 'are you not the messiah?'

This reading is set down for the Sunday that marks the transition from the season of Pentecost to Advent. It goes by the name of the Feast of Christ the King. There is an irony here. Jesus does not really call himself a king and yet he teaches many parables which have to do with him seeking to convey what the kingdom of God is like. The idea that Jesus is 'the king' only emerges in the trial scenes and here on the cross. This kingdom is unlike the pomp and majesty that we might associate with earthly kingdoms and empires. It presumes an understanding of life that is often at a far removed from the politics of our day.

The Jeremiah reading looks to a time beyond the distress of Israel's captivity. It is a time and culture that assumes that the people of Israel are like the flock of God's pasture. Their well-being and future will come through new shepherds who will be raised up. The link is made to a 'righteous branch' of David who tended the sheep as a boy and will become Israel's king.

These two readings together invite us to consider how we lived out our personal lives and our lives together in the kingdom and how we have allowed ourselves to be shepherded by Christ through all its ups and downs.

The epistle for this Sunday is Colossians:11-20. It enlarges the horizon further for it professes how all things were made in, through and for Christ. That reading is reflected in the music and poems below in Alana Levadoski's 'The Christ hymn'.


If a congregation member feels someone in the congregation may be interested or would be ideal as an Elder of St. Matthew's please nominate them.

# **Advent Studies for this year**

The coming Season of Avent in the Christian calendar commences on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> November. We traverse from a gospel year in Luke into a year featuring Matthew.

This means that we move from a year featuring gentiles and the needy to a focus on Jewish people, the chosen people of God as viewed by Matthew.

We will be engaged in Three studies this advent, at weekly intervals.

The first will be led by Clive Pearson who will provide us with much food for thought. He will draw comparisons between the Advent story of Christmas as presented by both Matthew and Luke and provide some clues about what will follow in Matthew as we explore this Gospel in 2023.

Drawing on the information provided by Clive, the following two weeks of the study will be led by Michael Strong and will first involve reflections on the events leading up to the birth of Jesus. The second will consider the entry of Herod and horrid actions he inflicted on male children in Bethlehem and the flight of Jesus and his family to Egypt. This exploration will continue through to the exchanges between John the Baptist and Jesus.

# Advent 1 Hope

## Theme:

The coming (again) of Christ Candle of Hope Christmas Bowl

Sunday 27 November:

8am, 9:30am & 6:45pm

**Bible Readings:** 

Isaiah 2:1-5 Matthew 24:36-44 O come, O come, Emmanuel ..... today is the first Sunday in the Christian New Year: it is the first Sunday in Advent ... and we change our script. This year our focus turns to the gospel of the Matthew. The way in which its account of Jesus unfolds is a little different from Luke and so we will gradually become more aware of who Matthew's audience was and his distinctive understanding of the gospel and what the good news might mean for us as seen through his lens.

It is rather strange in some way that every year our readings for Advent come from towards the end of the gospel for the year rather than the beginning. That is because Advent is a season when we approach (again) the Christmas stories and also because Advent has to do with the expectation that Christ will come again.

come again.

The spirituality of the Advent season is often signified by the call to be 'watchful', to expect, to hope. Our Matthew reading for this week likens the coming of the Son of Man (Jesus) to the days of Noah. In the early church the Noah cycle played a more prominent role in understanding the gospel than it does today. In a way the Noah imagines a -'re-set': in these stories from the early chapters of Genesis God begins again with a new humanity and a rainbow covenant with 'all flesh'. The

second coming of Christ presumes the fulfilment of hopes that the kingdom of God that he proclaimed will be filly realized. The Noah saga nevertheless carries words of warning: Noah's advice to his fellows is ignored; he prepares for the floods that will come but they disregard these gloomy prophecies and do not turn away from their wrong-doing and turn again to God. Our reading from Matthew captures something of that apocalyptic mood when the purposes of God break in unexpectedly on a seemingly unprepared humanity. Life, like it was in the time of Noah, was carrying on normally' ... But the apocalyptic breaks in ...

It is a standard convention for the Advent New Testament readings to be accompanied by verses from the book of Isaiah. This book is written over an extended period of time and falls into three parts. The Advent / Christmas readings tend to come from the first part, the Easter readings from the second, the season of Pentecost from the third. In this reading from (first) Isaiah there is an expectation of people 'from all nations' (an Isaiah trait) seeking out the ways of the Lord and the prospect of an end to war. The Isaiah reading presents a counterbalance to the apocalyptic urgency found in Isaiah.


