# Something to think about

## 10 December 2nd Sunday of Advent PEACE

Lectionary Readings: Isaiah 40:1-1 Psalm 85:1-2, 8-13 2 Peter 3: 8-15 Mark 1: 1-8

#### Being at Peace and Peace-filled to Be Peaceful to Share Peace with Others

Peace is a nice idea, but when we stop to think about it there is a lot to think about when it comes to peace. There are many facets to peace. Peace is a bit like the word love in that way. It is one simple word which describes a whole lot of different things and feelings. There is peace of mind, peaceful states of emotions, peace in our thinking, peace in our relationships – with our self, others, our community, the world, between others, between individuals, between groups of people. Then there is peace in terms of a lack of conflict as well peace in terms of calm, stillness or quiet.

Having worked out all the different kinds of peace and different aspects of peace, then the real issue becomes how we bring peace about, how we work for peace and how we make peace. It is easy to talk about hope, peace, joy and love in Advent. It is easy to declare that Jesus is the 'Prince of Peace.' However, it is another thing to practically live such ideas out. Most of us will have a story about a Christmas family gathering which was anything but peaceful. There is the chaos and stress of having everyone over and making sure everything is prepared. There is the ruckus of everyone gathering and greeting each other, then the present opening and the hubbub over the meal. If that wasn't enough, many of us will have been at family gatherings full or tension or outright conflict. Peace is a nice enough concept and one that we celebrate at Christmas and during Advent, but it is a lot of hard work.

It is no accident that peace is part of the liturgical season of Advent. With God as Christ being celebrated amongst us, peace is one of our works that God calls us to as a people. Thus a whole week is given over to considering peace and learning more about peace. This is needed each year for the world just can't seem to get to peace for long. Many will know of the story of Christmas in World War 1 where troops on both sides ceased fire and met together to celebrate Christmas together, and then the next day went back to attacking each other. This irony is lived out in us in our lives as individuals and as communities at Christmas.

Peace is there for us to work for and claim. It is there because God is at work in us and with us and in others and with others. God in the person of Christ comes to bring peace. God as the person of the Holy Spirit is always at work for peace. That is why one of the Fruit of the Spirit is peace. We have work to do if we are to truly be God's people the Church. Where is there peace-lessness in our community? What might we need to do to bring peace or make peace? How might we go about doing that? How do we keep doing that or keep the peace once we have found, built or established it? Peace is something to deeply think and pray about.

#### Peace is There

Peace is there, God. Peace is there when we look for it It may not be in stillness. It may not be in silence. It may not be when things quiet. It may not be in the way that we would have it, But peace is there if we just stop and see it. Peace is there when we choose to stop agitating. Peace is there when we stop ruminating. Peace is there when we stop complaining Peace is there when we stop coveting. Peace is there when we stop arguing. Peace is there when we stop agitating. Peace is there when we stop disturbing. Peace is there when we stop provoking. Peace is there when we stop harming. Peace is there when we stop fighting. Peace is there in our agency. Peace is there within our power. Peace is there when we choose to act for it. Peace is there when we work for it. Peace is there, found when we find forgiveness for others. Peace is there, found when we find forgiveness for ourselves. Peace is there when we find satisfaction in what we have instead of what we have not. Peace is there when we accept things as they are, but with faith and hope still abounding.

Peace is there in justice. Peace is there in equity. Peace is there in sharing. Peace is there in reconciliation. Peace is there in meaning and purpose. Peace is there in striving. Peace is there in doing our best. For peace is there, Always waiting patiently, Because you are there, For you are where peace is. Peace is there when in faith and hope we are in connection with you, Peace is there with you, And you can lead us into peace. There may still be chaos. There may still be trouble. There may still be struggle. There may still be hardship. There may still be sadness. There may still be grief. Things may still be wrong. There may still be evil. But, with you we can be peace-full. There is peace with you. There is peace to teach us. There is peace to learn. There is peace to be found. Find us when we have lost our peace. Teach is where our peace can be found. May there be peace in us, So that there may be peace with others, And there may be peace in the world. There is peace, we pray. Amen.

## Bringing Peace to refugees in Ethiopia


