Something to think about

17 December 3rd Sunday of Advent

Lectionary Readings:

Isaiah 61: 1-4, 8-11
Psalm 126 or Luke 1: 46b-55
1 Thessalonians 5: 16-24
John 1: 6-8, 19-28

Joy

Joy like love and hope is a complex word. We all sort of know what it is, but when we have to define it or describe what it actually is, then it is not as easy as we assume it to be.

Joy and happiness are often used interchangeably. However, happiness technically refers to the pleasurable feelings (emotions) that result from a situation, experience, or objects, whereas joy is a state of mind that can be found even in times of grief or uncertainty. In the sermon this we I quote a young person who describes joy as, "the combination of peace and happiness."

In Biblical Greek there are several words for joy.

χαρά (chara) joy

χαίρω (chairo) joyful

εὐφροσύνη (eufrosuney) glad joy

ἀγαλλίασις (agalliasis) great joy

In Hebrew there are three main words for joy

אַמְחָה (simcha), joy, gladness, mirth, is one of the most prevalent words in the Bible.

שָׁמֵחַ (sameach [saw-may' akh]) glad, joyful, merry

ששון (sasson), exultation, rejoicing, The English word, 'sassy' is said to be derived from this.

There is also חֶּדְוֶה (chedvâh, [khed-vaw]) gladness, joy, This word is only used twice in the Bible and is directly connected with knowing God.

It is not easy to untangle the idea of joy from happiness. However, there is something deeper about joy than happiness. The idea that is about being connected with God is important as that comes both from the Hebrew word and the notion that joy is a fruit of the Spirit.

For me there is a flow-on pathway from hope to peace and to joy. Joy is perhaps peace combined with happiness. At least if one has no sense of peace, it is almost impossibly to experience joy. To have any sense of peace, even in the hardest of times, we need hope. To have hope requires faith, and faith is that trust that God is present as a source of comfort and support as well as being at work for good, even if it isn't the miraculous transformation of our suffering or hardship.

In our readings, there is the Magnificat – Mary's song of joy. She sings of joy, and we who are religious might just nod our heads and think that she is saint and that is the sort of things saints do. However, Mary was deeply troubled at first. She was likely stressed and worried. How do you get people to believe that you have the Son of God in you? How do you fend of claims of immorality and shame? She was almost divorced by Joseph, and then as her time came to give birth she had to travel a long way and away from her family and the women who would normally midwife for her. Yet, in knowing the truth and in trusting God and the hope that the angel spoke of, she had a sense of peace and could sing with joy.

Then we have, alongside of John the Baptiser assuring people that he was just a prophet and messenger for the One to come, we have Paul exhorting the Church of Thessalonica in Greece to "rejoice always" and to "give thanks in all circumstances." Paul who himself was not a stranger to hardship, new this was not an easy thing. Again, this points to joy being a mindset rather than simply an emotion. Paul links this with the work God is doing in us. That is why in another letter he describes it as being an element of the 'fruit of the Spirit.' This fruit is not just something God simply imbues or manifests in us, but are disciplines that we take up in order to better manifest God and demonstrate our synchronicity with God's will and way which we know in the teaching of God in the person of Jesus.

So, yes, joy is an emotion and a deep one at that. However, it is also a mindset as well as a state of mind that we can work to put ourselves in. It is furthermore a work for us to do, not only for ourselves, but for others.

The active discipleship and applied learning activities for this week's service provide some encouragement to take up this work of joy. It is both about being joyful and about sharing that joy, even if only like Mary does to God – of course as biblical eavesdroppers, we get to benefit from.

Joy is therefore something to very much think about.

New floors, a bit of paint and the removal of the compactus storage unit from the kitchens. The new floor will be laid on 16 January so the old floors need to be removed before this can be done.


<u>SATURDAY 6 JANUARY</u> will be the start of the demolition and then we move onto to the painting.




